ALTERNATIVE CONCEPTS PUBLIC WORKSHOP SCHEDULED

In August 2022, Lake County began the North Lake Trail Phase 3 Project Development and Environment (PD&E) Study from E. Altoona Road to State Road 40. This proposed trail is part of the River to Hills regional trail and is located within unincorporated Lake County, the Ocala National Forest, Altoona, and Astor Park. Alternative trail concepts have been developed and you are invited to attend the Alternative Concepts Public Workshop on **Thursday**, **June 8, 2023** beginning at **5:30 p.m.**

Lake County is offering three ways to participate in the meeting. All participants, regardless of which platform they choose, will receive the same information.

- In-Person Open House Option: Participants may attend in person by going to the First Baptist Church of Umatilla (Events Center) located at 550 Hatfield Drive, Umatilla, Florida 32784. The meeting will be held as an open house from 5:30 p.m. to 7:30 p.m. Participants may review project information, view a looping project video, provide comments, and discuss the project with the study team at any time throughout the meeting. Information about nearby projects will also be available for review.
- <u>Virtual Option</u>: Interested persons may join from a computer, tablet or mobile device at 5:30 p.m. For this option, advance registration is required by visiting <u>https://attendee.gotowebinar.com/</u> <u>register/6577903509956582486</u>. Once registered, participants will receive a confirmation email containing information about joining the workshop online. Please use Chrome or Microsoft Edge as your internet browser to register and attend this webinar.

ALTERNATIVE TRAIL CONCEPTS EVALUATED

Following the Project Overview Public Meeting and additional agency coordination, the trail alternatives have been divided into six segments (Figure 1).

The "Build" alternatives and the "No Build" alternative are being evaluated based on a number of criteria including: trail design & safety, social & cultural resources, natural resources, physical resources, local & regional support, and costs.

These evaluations will support decisions regarding the alternatives developed and identification of the best trail alternative. This information will be presented to the public during the Alternative Concepts Public Workshop (see article on front page for more details).


