




PURPOSE

- Lack of safe, comfortable and accessible pedestrian bicycle facilities




DESIGN SEGMENT LOCATION

In 2022, Lake County initiated the design phase for the North Lake Trail segment that generally follows State Road 19 from E. Collins Street (in Umatilla) to E. Altoona Road (in Altoona) as presented in the map.


This segment is approximately 3 miles in length. The northern terminus of this project (E. Altoona Road) is also the southern terminus for the North Lake Trail segment that is undergoing the **Project Development and Environment (PD&E) Study**.

DESIGN SEGMENT TIMELINE




Note: At this time, it is unknown as to when activities beyond the design phase (right-of-way acquisition and construction) will be completed.





PROPOSED 8' WIDE TRAIL WITH CURB & GUTTER & GUARDRAIL




SEGMENT A: SR 19 FROM E ALTOONA RD TO CR 445


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
PROPOSED 14' WIDE TRAIL WITH DRAINAGE SWALE







PROPOSED 14' WIDE TRAIL WITH DRAINAGE SWALE



PROPOSED 12' WIDE TRAIL WITH DRAINAGE SWALE




PROPOSED 14' WIDE TRAIL WITH DRAINAGE SWALE





SEGMENT D: CR 445 FROM SR 19 TO SPRING CREEK BRIDGE

PROPOSED 8' WIDE TRAIL WITH CURB AND GUTTER




PROPOSED 14' WIDE TRAIL WITH DRAINAGE SWALE




SEGMENT E: CR 445 FROM SPRING CREEK BRIDGE TO CR 445A - CR 445A TO SR 40
